Dear A&M System Training Coordinators,

Just wanted to let you know that four new online courses will be added to the Alphabetical Master Course List in TrainTraq before close of business today.

- FEMA IS-100.a - Introduction to the Incident Command System (ICS)
- FEMA IS-200.a - Single Resource & Initial Action Incidents
- FEMA IS-700 - Introduction to the National Incident Management System (NIMS)
- FEMA IS-800.b – Introduction to the National Response Framework

We are adding these courses because some System member universities plan to require certain employees to complete this training as part of their emergency management plan development process. The courses were developed by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) and are hosted on a FEMA website. Each TrainTraq course links to one FEMA course and prompts users to acknowledge that they've completed the training when they are done. Attached please find a copy of a TrainTraq page for one of these courses; all four courses are implemented in a similar way.

We do not currently plan to require this training at the System level. We are simply making the courses available via TrainTraq so that System members who do require the training can assign and track these courses.
