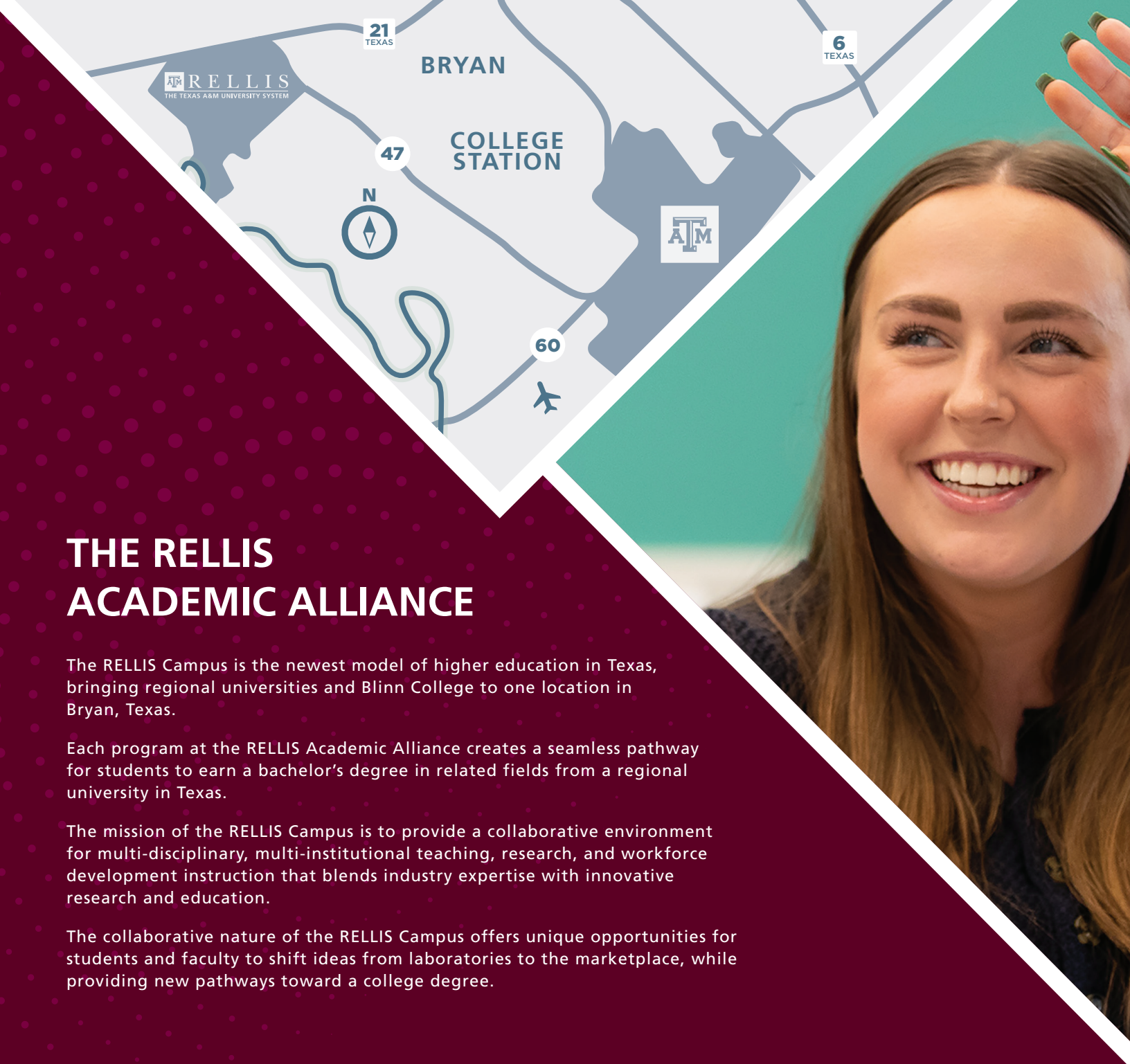

THE TEXAS A&M UNIVERSITY SYSTEM

Established in 1948, the Texas A&M University System has evolved into one of the largest systems of higher education in the nation, with an extensive network of 11 universities, eight state agencies, and a System administration office.

Each of the A&M System members has its own unique mission, history, and goals. Together, they provide research, educational programs and community enhancement services that improve the lives of people in Texas and around the world.

With more than 26,000 faculty and staff positions, the A&M System has a physical presence in 250 of the state's 254 counties and a programmatic presence in every county.

This network allows members to educate over 153,000 students and make more than 22 million additional education contacts through service and outreach programs each year.



Recognized throughout the Brazos Valley for its innovative programs, the Blinn College District serves as an onsite RELLIS partner. This partnership provides a single access point for students to earn associate degrees and complete the lower-division coursework needed for a bachelor's degree.

The Blinn College District offers academic transfer, workforce training, and continuing education classes for more than 19,000 students. 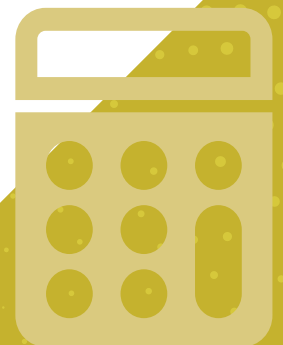

ADMISSIONS CHECKLIST

How to Apply for Freshman/Dual Admissions

- 1.** Through GoApplyTexas.org, complete and submit two (2) applications: one (1) to Blinn College and one (1) to the regionally accredited university hosting your desired program at RELLIS.
- 2.** Pay the non-refundable application processing fee. Application fee varies based on desired regional university.
- 3.** Report test scores required for admission, including SAT/ACT, TSI, STAAR, or other state-mandated standardized test, and submit official transcripts from high school/dual credit.*
- 4.** Check with a RELLIS Representative for eligibility requirements for all available degree programs.

Additional Notes

- A question/option will be prompted on the application for students to indicate interest in attending the RELLIS Campus. Reach out to the RELLIS Admissions team for assistance with a specific institution's application.
- Test score requirements vary based on desired regional university.
- Competitive applicants exceed minimum admission requirements.
- International applicants may be required to submit additional documents.

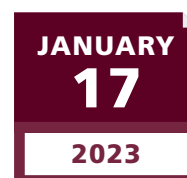

How to Apply for Transfer Admissions

- 1.** Through GoApplyTexas.org, submit your application to the regionally accredited university hosting your desired program at the RELLIS Campus.
- 2.** If registering for lower-level coursework required for bachelor's degree completion, submit a second application to the Blinn College District at RELLIS.
- 3.** Pay non-refundable application processing fee. Application fee varies based on desired regional university.
- 4.** Submit official transcripts from all previous colleges and universities attended, including dual credit.
- 5.** Submit official high school transcripts.

Additional Notes

- A question/option will be prompted on the application for students to indicate interest in attending the RELLIS Campus.
- Competitive applicants exceed minimum admission requirements.
- International applicants may be required to submit additional documents.
