Student Veteran Need Assessment Survey

The purpose of this assessment survey is to measure student veteran use and awareness of current services and to identify potential resource and service additions. It is not to internally evaluate current services. The results of the survey will lead to further exploration and research including focus group and in-depth interviews. The outcomes from the assessment research, including this survey, will lead development of signature programs and services and drive strategic campus relationships.

This work is tied to the VRSC first year goal to develop, implement and assess programs to positively impact student veteran academic performance, holistic development and future employment.

Survey sample:

There will be two sample groups. The first will include all students who began this past January. That sample will be provided by Col. Smith. Student Life Studies will determine the other sample from undergraduate and graduate student veterans enrolled prior to January 2013.

This survey will only focus on veterans and will not include military dependents. Dependents will be addressed in future assessment measures.

From this sample, Student Life Studies can pull basic demographic data including major, GPA, transfer student or new student, gender, ethnicity, classification and college/major.

Survey Structure and Questions:

The survey will be broken into five sections to include: Academics, Student Life, Career Plans, Demographics and Recommendations. Section titles on the actual survey may vary for the better understanding of the survey sample.

Each section will include a brief intro and/or description of the questions in the section. It will be the goal to have the survey take no more than 10 minutes.
