Mission

The mission of the Dallas College, College Credit for Heroes program is to accelerate entry of military and veteran students into the civilian workforce with the award of academic credit earned through military service.





Need Statement

- Recognition of the academic validity of military training is essential to valuing military service and providing tangible support.
- Consistent and transparent award of academic credit is a key element for recruitment and engagement.
- The award of credit can be a complicated issue and a variety of solutions are in place.

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Military Transcript Evaluation

Joint Services Transcripts (JST)

Evaluations of the JSTs are completed using the Dallas College Military Transfer Credits (MTC) database. Credit can only be awarded training previously evaluated and included in the data base.

Community College of the Air Force (CCAF) Transcript Evaluations

• Since the CCAF is an accredited institution, transcripts are evaluated through regular Dallas College processes for all other colleges.

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Military Training Evaluation Methods

Proactive - evaluation of military training, as contained in the ACE Military Guide, by a program or academic area.

Reactive - Review of individual military training after student request.

Portfolio – TBD - Expanded opportunity for individual students to be granted additional credit for experience above that granted for documented academic achievement.

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Military Transfer Credit (MTC)

Used for the internal evaluation of Joint Services Transcript (JST)

Is a transparent tool for all stakeholders (including potential students)

Currently houses over 2500 military training evaluations, completed by DC faculty.

Academic areas of concentration include Business, Management, Welding, HVAC, Automotive, Paralegal and others.

Expected to continue to grow as new training evaluations are completed. (Culinary is coming soon)

Provides consistent and transparent award of academic credit.

Allows input of military training (ACE course ID) and an output recommended credit.



Military Transfer Credits (MTC)

- Input screen
- Following slides show outcome examples.

How to Use

- 1. **ACE ID** Enter each ACE Identifier (ID) to determine if credit is recommended at Dallas College. For each Occupation, only enter the ACE ID which corresponds to the highest relevant paygrade.
- 2. **Version Number** Select the correct version number from the drop-down menu. If the message "Invalid ACE ID" appears the course or occupation does not have any recommended credit at this time.
 - For Courses the version number is to the right of the ACE ID on the JST. If no version number is available choose version 00.
 - For Occupations, if more than one option is available, enter the version number that corresponds with the highest paygrade documented for that occupation. (For example: 07 for E7).
- 3. Repeat the process for additional courses/ occupations by clicking the Add button under the Control section.
- 4. Finally, click **View Course Information** to process your request. Results will show which Dallas College courses are recommended for credit and the programs with greatest application.
- 5. To save your results, click "Save to PDF" button at the bottom of the page.

Disclaimer: The results are for planning purposes only final credit award will be completed after submission of an official transcript and results may vary. Not all Courses or Occupations will have credit recommendations at this time.

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Valuing Military Service

- The award of academic credit is a tangible way education institutions can show how for military training is valued.
- It may also be a supporting factor in degree completion and workforce entry.
- The award of credit can be a complicated issue and a variety of solutions are in place, but the transparent communication of processes and expected outcomes is not always readily available.
- I proposed that each institution of higher education consider providing transparent information to veterans and military members prior to enrollment so a more informed decision can be made.
- In addition to the individual institution statement, a general statement concerning military credit application to specific degree plans and across institutions would provide basic information regardless of intended program.

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- At a minimum the statement should include the following elements:
- General process
- Military service and documentation requirements
- Timing of evaluation and credit application –
- Number of credits awarded as general electives
- Standard credit awards
- What is not accepted
- Statement as to transferability of credit from other institutions
- Participation in state programs
- Inclusion of standard statement Applicability to specific degree plan Transferability of credit between institutions
